# Scooter Safety - Drive Responsibly

## GENERAL SAFETY MEASURES

- Wear a helmet—always. And fasten your chin strap
- Windshields or goggles protect your eyes
- Fix florescent strips to your clothes and to the side of your scooter to increase your visibility
- Wear 'fall protection'; choose gloves, long-sleeve jackets and long pants
- Secure all baggage; keep your handlebars free of packages

## YOUR BIKE

- Ensure that brakes, lights, horn and mirrors are fitted and working correctly
- Ensure that tyres are in good condition and inflated to correct pressure

## YOUR ACTIONS

- Overtake only on **BROKEN** white lines
- Overtake only on the right of traffic traveling in the same direction as you
- Look, when overtaking, for vehicles entering your carriageway from the left; they may be turning right across your path
- Look all around before maneuvering, behind you, to the sides and the front
- Keep your headlight on at all times; this helps you be seen even in daylight
- Carry one passenger only
- Ensure your passenger is properly seated, with feet on the footrests and wearing a helmet
